Holistic and Rigorous Experiences

Monday through Friday Academy programming begins at 8:35 am with morning training. Scholar-athletes have the opportunity to enroll in Honors Classes as a Sophomore and engage in rigorous academic experiences With an average class size of 10, scholar-athletes will have opportunities to actively participate in their classes, and their teachers will know them well. Each scholar-athlete will also be a part of the Academy's Point-Person Program. The Point-Person Program helps guide and support Sugar Bowl Academy scholar-athletes through their holistic academic-athletic-character experience.

Senior Project

As a prerequisite for graduation, all SBA seniors are required to complete a year-long senior project that becomes seniors' primary focus throughout the spring trimester. The Senior Project program is the academic capstone of the Sugar Bowl Academy experience that emphasizes independent inquiry and intellectual rigor. Scholar-athletes are required to write a 10-20-plus-page research paper, present for 20-30 minutes before the SBA community, and document their experience through a portfolio. Some scholar-athletes will also choose to create a product as a natural extension of their inquiry. All scholar-athletes learn the skills of annotating a bibliography, formal outlining, sourcing and citing research, interviewing, surveying, working with mentors, and more.

Grading & Class Rank

Sugar Bowl Academy's academic year is divided into trimesters with official grades reported at the end of each term. The Sugar Bowl Academy transcript reports a cumulative, unweighted GPA calculated on a 4.00 scale. Additional credit of 0.33 is awarded for an A+ grade (98%-100%) with a maximum GPA of 4.33. Coursework completed at other institutions does appear on a Sugar Bowl Academy transcript, yet GPAs include only coursework completed at Sugar Bowl Academy. Sugar Bowl Academy does not rank its student-athletes.
